- The distribution of the estate of David Etley awards his youngest dau. yet a minor Anna Mary lot # 3 in a plat in Middletown. This is obviously the lot # 3 in Mary Bl. Bolton's estate. This should be sufficient evidence to prove the connection between Anna Mary Ettley Plattenberger and Mary Bolton. That they are the same person and the wife of John Blattenberger, Jr, son of John Bl. II. He died before 26 Oct. 1813 and not in 1817 in Mississippi.

Orphans Court held Louisbourg in and for Co. of Dauphin, 15 June 1790 before Timothy Green, Joseph Montgomery, and John Murray, Justices of the Peace:

The Court appoints Philip Etley of Middletown, Dauphin Co., guardian over the person and estate of Anna Maria Etley, minor daughter of David Etley^{LATE} of Middletown, deceased, during her minority. She being under fourteen years of age. Upon the petition of John Philip Etley, Christiana Conrad, the widow of Michael Conrad, Christopher Heppeth (sic), intermarried with Catharine Etley, David Etley, and Philip Etley, guardian of Anna Maria Etley, minor child under the age of fourteen years, children and representatives of David Etley, late of Middletown, setting forth "that the said David Etley lately died intestate as to his real estate possessed of two tenements--missuger (sic) and lots of ground, one in Hummelstown and the other in Middletown, and one other lot situate in Middletown containing five acres, therefore praying the court to appoint five men to value property and if found it cannot be divided without spoiling the whole, to value same and report to the next Orphans Court." Five men were appointed. If it can be divided, report such partition to next proceedings of Orphans Court.

p. 259--19 August 1790.

Five men reported they have valued property and report to wit: One piece of ground in Hummelstown cannot be divided without spoiling same, value £25.

One lot in Middletown^{SMITH} can be divided to and amongst all the children.

To Philip Etley--oldest son--lot #6; Conrad Etley--second son--lot #1; David Etley--third son--lot #5; Christina Conrad--widow--eldest daughter--lot #4; Catharine Keppick (sic), the lawful wife of Christopher Heppick--lot #2; Anna Maria Etley, the youngest daughter and yet a minor--lot #3.

Lot #1, which is improved on, they order that Conrad Etley shall pay £25 to the other heirs to be divided equally among them.

The Court approves of such partition and John Philip Etley, eldest son, and Christopher Heppick, intermarried with Catharine, daughter of said deceased, pray that they be permitted to take part of the real estate not to be divided at the valuation aforesaid. The Court ordered they pay heirs their respective shares in one year, the same John Philip Etley and Christopher Heppick their heirs and assigns forever as fully and freely as the said David Etley, deceased, had and held them in his lifetime.....

Acknowledged in open court Sept. 21, 1790.

March 1st 1816.

John Blattenberger vs. John Bomberger Administrator of the Estate of John Blattenberger deceased. The latter of Middletown de & appears in court and produces his account duly passed by the Register by which there appears to be a balance of Two hundred and Sixty six dollars and seventy five cents in his hands which account is approved and confirmed.

On motion of George Fisher Esquire stating that there are debts yet due from the estate of John Blattenberger deceased of Middletown de & to an amount larger than the balance in the hands of John Bomberger his Administrator, and praying the court to appoint auditors to settle and adjust the proportions &c. The court appoints

Jacob Ludwig John Ludwig a minor above the age of fourteen years of Middletown de & to appear in court and show what debts are due from the estate of John Blattenberger deceased and what is due to his estate.

The court appoints Friedrich Suter and Daniel Miller joint guardians over the persons and estate of David and Peter Ludwig minor children under the age of fourteen years of Middletown de & during their minority.

Jacob Wain vs. on Motion of Henry Macken Esquire the court appoints a citation to Conrad Kuepfer & Michael Wain Administrators of Jacob Wain deceased to appear in court and show their administration account upon the estate of the said deceased.

John Blattenberger vs. on Motion of Thomas Elder Esquire the court appoints John Bomberger guardian over the person and estate of Thomas Blattenberger a minor now under the age of fourteen years of John Blattenberger deceased during his minority.

John Senigand vs. on Motion of Thomas Elder Esquire the court appoints Christian Frey guardian over the person and estate of John Senigand a minor now under the age of fourteen years of John Senigand deceased during his minority.
