Johannes Ludwig was born at Hof Plattenberg in Bavaria and was christened at the Catholic Church in Buchbach.

While still in Bavaria, Johannes married Barbara Palmer, daughter of Johan and Christine (Majer) Palmer. The exact date of their marriage is unknown. According to a memorium prepared at the time of Barbara's death in 1758, the couple was married in 1734. However, at that time Johannes would have been only 13 years of age. Their first child was born in 1737. Therefore it is more likely that they married around that time. In 1737, at the time of their marriage, Johannes was only 16 years of age while Barbara was 25, nine years older.

Johannes and Barbara had two children born in Germany, Anna Maria, born in 1737, and Philip, born in 1741. Two years later they left Bavaria for the new world with their two children.

They traveled to America with a group of Moravians who were sponsored by Count Zinzendorf, who was actively seeking new colonists for the Moravian communities in Bethlehem and Lancaster in Pennsylvania. The group was known as the "2nd Moravian Colony". *delete*

Johannes and his family arrived at Philadelphia on the ship "Lydia" on 19 September 1743 (qualified 20 September). The ship, commanded by Captain James Ambergrombie, sailed from Rotterdam, Holland with a stop at Cowes, England. The list of the names and ages of the adult male passengers on board the "Lydia", which was prepared by Captain Ambergrombie, includes "Johannes Plattenberger, age 22.

On 20 September 1743 Johannes, along with the other male adult arrivals, went to the courthouse in Philadelphia, to swear their allegiance to King George of England and to the English Colonial government. These oaths, known as the oath of allegiance and the oath of abjuration, were required by laws enacted in 1727 and 1729. Johannes' name was entered on the signature lists by the court clerks, who were English, as "Johannes Plattenberger" on the oath of allegiance and as "Johannes Blattenberger" on the oath of abjuration list. Johannes witnessed his name on both oaths with a double cross mark, indicating he could not write his name at that time. (Source: Strassburger and Hinke, "Pennsylvania German Pioneers", Vol. 1, pp. 340 to 343)

Shortly after their arrival in 1743, Johannes and his family settled in Warwick Township in Lancaster Co., PA where they became members of the Moravian Church. Johannes was listed as paying taxes in Warwick Twp. in 1751 (John Blateberger) and again in 1754 (John Plataberger). In 1756 he served as Tax Collector in Warwick Twp. In 1759 he was assessed for 200 acres in Warwick Twp. Land records also show that he bought and sold various parcels of land in Warwick Twp. between the years 1762 and 1779. He also started a weaving business which was taken over by his son, Peter, after Johannes retired.

During the period between 1743 and 1756, Johannes and Barbara had eight more children, all born in Lancaster Co., PA. Four of their children died in

childhood and were buried in the Moravian cemetery at Lititz, PA:
Philip and Elizabeth in 1749, Nathaniel in 1751, and Anna Rosina in 1758.

In January of 1758 Johannes' wife, Barbara, fell ill and passed away at the age of 46. She was buried in the Moravian Cemetery at Lititz, PA on 30 January 1758.

Two years later, on 19 August 1760, Johannes remarried Otilia Margarethe (Zimmerman) Boetzell of Atolhoe at St. Paul's Reformed Church at Manheim, PA. They had two children, daughters Anna Rosina born in 1761, and Margaretha, born about two years later. Around 1767 Johannes and Otilia moved to Manheim Twp. in Lancaster Co., PA where Johannes set up a weaving business. In the 1790 census Johannes was listed in Manheim Twp. with one male over the age of 16 and one female in his household. By the following year, 1791, Johannes had moved again, to Rapho Twp. in Lancaster Co., PA.

Late in life Johannes retired and his son, Peter, took over the weaving business that he had founded. Johannes also gave each of his two youngest daughters, Anna Rosina and Margaretha, a property in Manheim Twp. "in return for their affections".

On 29 October 1791 Johannes wrote his last will and testament. He directed that his "just debts and funeral expenses be paid off and discharged" and bequeathed "unto his beloved wife Margaret all of his goods, chattels, effects, and personal estate whatsoever to and for her proper use and benefit and to be at her disposal". He further gave and bequeathed unto his wife Margaret all of his "messuages, tenements, lands and lots of ground and real estate whatsoever and wheresoever" which he was in possession of at the time of his death.

He further directed that, after the decease of his wife Margaret, all of his "messuages, tenements, lands, lots of ground and real estate whatsoever with their appurtenances" were given and devised to his eight children "to wit John Blattenberger, Christian Blattenberger, Daniel Blattenberger, Frederick Blattenberger, Peter Blattenberger, Anna Maria Berstler (widow and relict of John Berstler deceased), Rosina the wife of George Hauenstein, and Margaret the wife of John Eby". Lastly he appointed his wife, Margaret, son-in-law George Hauenstein, and trusty friend, John Baker, of Rapho Twp. the executors of his estate. The witnesses to Johannes' will were Lewis Frederick Machold and Philip Glonninger. (Lancaster Co. will book I, vol. 1, p. 34)

Johannes died around March of 1794 in Rapho Twp., Lancaster Co., PA. His burial location is not known. On 28 March 1794 his will was proved and letters of administration were granted to Margaret Blattenberger, George Hauenstein and John Baker, who were ordered to exhibit an inventory and render an accounting of his estate. An inventory of Johannes' "goods and chattels" was made on 12 April 1794 by appraisers Frederick Nauman and John Flam and was registered in Lancaster, PA on 26 April 1794.

The family name "Palmer" also appears in some early records as "Balmer".

According to a memorium (Curriculum Vitae) prepared at the time of her death in 1758, Barbara's parents were Mennonites and she was brought up according to their faith. Growing older she turned more and more to the Reformed Church. After hearing the preachings of several Moravian ministers, Barbara was officially admitted to the Moravian congregation in Warwick, Lancaster Co., PA in November of 1749.

Barbara fell ill on the 16th of January 1758 and passed away on 26 January 1758. She was buried in the Moravian Cemetery at Lititz.

Several of Barbara's brothers also emigrated to America and lived nearby in Lancaster Co., PA. Carl Diedrich and Christian Palmer arrived at Philadelphia on 11 August 1732 on the ship "Samuel". On the ship's list of passengers, Carl was shown as 20 years of age and Christian as 24. Their name was shown as "Balmer". (Strassburger and Hinke, "Pennsylvania German Pioneers", Vol. I, pp. 60, 64, 65). A third brother, Michael Palmer, arrived five years later on 5 October 1737 on the ship "Townsend", (Strassburger and Hinke, "Pennsylvania German Pioneers", Vol. I, pp. 185, 186, 187).

Christian Palmer was born in August 1703 and died at Warwick Twp. in Lancaster Co., PA on 8 March 1778. He was married twice; first to Susanna Brunck and then to Barbara Pichler and had thirteen children. Michael Palmer died in Warwick Twp. on 20 September 1749 at the age of 40 years. Nothing further is known of her brother, Carl Diedrich Palmer.

CHILD 1 - Anna Maria BLATTENBERGER-18

The records of Schoeneck Moravian Church show that Anna Maria was born in Alpisheim (or Olpisheim) in the Lower Pfaltz in Germany.

Anna Maria emigrated to America with her parents in 1743 at the age of six. In 1758, when her mother died, she was living in the Moravian "House of Sisterhood" in Bethlehem, PA. While in Bethlehem she met John George Buerstler. They were married at the Bethlehem Moravian Church by Brother Petri.

After her husband died in 1790, Anna Maria may have lived with her son, Jacob Buerstler, near Schoeneck in Northampton Co., PA. Anna Maria died there and was buried in the Moravian Church cemetery at Schoeneck, PA

CHILD 2 - Philip BLATTENBERGER-19

Philip died in childhood and was buried in the Moravian Cemetery at Lititz, PA.

CHILD 3 - Daniel BLATTENBERGER-20

Daniel signed an oath of allegiance for the second time on 2 December 1788.

In the 1790 census, Daniel was living in Lancaster Boro with one male over the age of 16, two males under 16, and three females.

CHILD 4 - Johannes BLATTENBERGER (II)-21

Johannes operated a blacksmith shop in Lancaster Boro. By 1810 he had moved to

Middletown in Dauphin Co., PA where he was a tavern keeper.

Johannes was a Sergeant in the Revolutionary War. During the period from 30 December 1775 to March 1776 he served as Sergeant of the Guard on 12 January 1776 and again on 10 February 1776. During that time he guarded Hessian prisoners of war. He is listed in the DAR Patriot Index.

Johannes was listed in the 1790 census in Lancaster Boro with one male over the age of 16, three males under the age of 16, and four females. Later he moved to Middletown, PA.

According to family records in the possession of Johannes' grand-daughter, Rachel Snavely, daughter of Magdalena (Blattenberger) Snavely, Johannes had five children by his first wife and thirteen children by his second wife. Baptismal records have been found at Trinity Lutheran Church in Lancaster for three of the five children by his first wife and seven of the thirteen children by his second wife. The last of these baptisms at Trinity Lutheran Church took place in 1789. The remaining children, who were all born after that date, may have been baptized after Johannes moved his family to Middletown, PA. (Pennsylvania Historical Society Library, Philadelphia, PA, file Gen Ro 10)

Johannes is buried in St. Peter's Church cemetery, Middletown. He wrote a will on 2 August 1810 which was probated 28 June 1813 (Will book D, p. 21, Dauphin Co., PA) To his beloved wife, Mary, he bequeathed beds and furniture. He directed that the residual of his property was to be sold and "put at interest" after the debts are paid, with the interest paid to his wife. Mary was also to have the use of the real estate while she remained a widow. He directed Mary to "raise my son Isaac and my daughter Nancy and give them schooling". He also specified that "If my wife marries, then the real estate is to be sold and divided between wife Mary and sons John, George, Philip, Isaac, Jacob and daughters Rachel, Catharine, Molly, Peggy, and Nancy equally except certain items of furniture devised to daughter Molly in addition to her equal share". He further directed that his "interest in the shop and ground now occupied by John Bomberger" was "to be divided equally and the accounts charged against my children are to be part of their shares in my estate". Lastly he appointed his wife, Mary, son-in-law John Bomberger, and son Philip, executors of his estate. His will was witnessed by Philip Youngblood and Elisha Green.

Children Nancy and Isaac were still minors and were appointed guardians. On 16 March 1816 the executors reported a balance in the estate of \$18.07 1/2. On 20 December 1820, Isaac Blattenberger, son of John (II), filed for court approval of Elisha Green as his guardian (his previous guardian may have died).

CHILD 5 - Christian Ludwig PLATTENBERGER-22

Salome Mueller was Christian's second wife. The name of his first wife is unknown. It does not appear that he had any children by his first marriage.

Christian moved from Lancaster County to Northampton County, PA around 1769 and settled in Nazareth Twp. near the village of Schoeneck. He was

associated with the Moravian Church in Schoeneck, near Nazareth. However, it is not certain that he was a confirmed member.

Christian served as a Private in the 3rd Company, 2nd Battalion in the Revolutionary War.

In the 1790 census, Christian (listed as Christian Platabergher) was living in Nazareth Twp. in Northampton Co., PA. Living in his household were one male over the age of 16, three males under 16, and one female.

Sometime between 1800 and 1820 (probably after the death of his wife in 1806), he moved to Baltimore Co., Maryland, with his son, Joseph. In 1820 Christian was living in the 3rd Ward, Baltimore, and son Joseph in N. Twp., Baltimore Co. Christian probably died there. His burial site has not been found.

CHILD 6 - Elizabeth BLATTENBERGER-23

Elizabeth is buried in the Moravian Cemetery at Lititz, PA.

CHILD 7 - Nathaniel BLATTENBERGER-24

Nathaniel died in childhood and was buried in the Moravian Cemetery at Lititz, PA.

CHILD 8 - Frederick BLATTENBERGER-25

Frederick was listed in the 1790 census in Rapho Twp., Lancaster County, PA with one male over the age of 16, three males under 16, and one female.

He was a blacksmith and also worked in the glass factory of Baron Von Stiegel.

Frederick was a Private in the 10th regiment of foot soldiers under Jacob Weaver. This company was raised in the fall of 1776 and fought in various actions and skirmishes in New Jersey. Then they fought in the battles of Brandywine and Germantown and, in June 1778, at Monmouth.

CHILD 9 - Peter BLATTENBERGER-26

Peter served with the 77th Battalion of Lancaster Co. Militia.

Peter and Susanna were married at the First Reformed Church (now United Church of Christ), Lancaster.

Peter learned the weaving trade from his father. He operated a weaving business at Manheim which was continued by his sons and grandsons in the late 1800s. While living at Manheim, Peter and his wife were members of st. Paul's Reformed Church.

In 1790 Peter was living in Manheim Twp., Lancaster Co., PA with one male over the age of 16 and two females in his household.

On 14 September 1823, while ill in bed in his home in Manheim, PA., Peter declared his last will and testament. He bequeathed all of his estate to his wife, Susanna, during her natural life and directed that his children were to "aid her in support of the family by carrying on the weaving trade", except for children, Jacob and Susanna, who were handicapped. After the death of

intermarriage of his widow, his house and lot of ground and other buildings were to be given to sons, Jacob and Peter Jr., who were directed to pay \$500 to the estate within one year of taking possession. Peter also gave his widow permission to dispose of any of the out lots of ground which he owned near the town of Manheim. After his widow's intermarriage or death, the remaining estate was bequeathed equally to his six children. He appointed sons, Jacob and Peter Jr., the executors. Peter's declaration was witnessed by John Thome and Michael Kauffman.

Before the writing of the will was completed Peter "was taken with violent fever and became incompetent to sign the same". He died the following morning. (Lancaster will book 0, vol. 1, p. 95)

CHILD 10 - Anna Rosina BLATTENBERGER-27

Anna Rosina is buried in the Moravian Cemetery at Lititz.

Barbara Plattenbergerin, nee Palmerin

It was on the 26th of January, 1758 when our 1st Sister Barbara Plattenbergerin, nee Palmerin, passed away. She was born in Sinsheim in the Palatinate (Germany) in 1712. Her parents were Mennonites and she was brought up according to their faith. Growing older she turned more and more to the Reformed Church.

It was in 1734 when she married Johannes Plattenberger who is a widower now. It was with him and their 2 children that they came to this country in 1743. She had been thriving since her childhood to become a good Christian - but she had not found peace until the day when she heard Brother Nyberg preaching here of the Mercy and Blessing that can only be given to sinners by the Blood of Jesus Christ. She then became a member of our congregation and was strengthened in her faith by talking to sisters and brothers such as the Neiberts and Heinrichs.

From that time on Jesus Christ became the center of her life; she turned to him with her sins and felt greatly relieved.

It was in November 1749, when the synodal preacher was in Warwick, when she was officially admitted to our congregation and on the 5th of July, 1750 she was admitted to Holy Communion. From that time on she was a faithful Christian, a caring mother and house-wife and a busy worker for our congregation.

She must have felt in advance that the end of her life was approaching for she prepared the shroud for herself a week ahead of her death.

On the 14th of this month she took the Holy Communion for the last time and on the following days she was so gay and in such good spirits that all her brothers and sisters with whom she had to do daily, wondered at her gaiety.

She fell ill on the 16th and from that day on she did not seem to notice anything going on around her and she did not even seem to recognize her children.

She only talked to her brother, about whom she was worried deep in her heart, once. Apart from that she did not show an interest in life any more and she only muttered of her deep desire to join Jesus Christ in Heaven.

On the 23rd she said to Sister Neiberin, who went to visit her, I am a poor and sinful little worm and when I go to Jesus Christ, I shall have nothing at all to show. But I will trust in His Blood and His Mercy and I will go to Him when He calls me.

She was 46 years old when she passed away on the 3rd day thereafter. We will keep her memory in our hearts.

She was a mother of 9 children of whom 4 sons and 2 daughters are still alive. The eldest daughter named Annemarie is in the House of Sisterhood in Bethlehem.

Barbara Plattenberger herself was buried on the 30th and a large funeral procession of all her relatives, neighbours and friends and many others followed her coffin.

Das Schreiben vom 14.10.1981 wurde mir von der Unterkantorektion in Bad Boll zugeliefert, da ich mich in besonderen mit allen familien- geschichtlichen Fragen in der Brüdergemeinde beschäftige. So ist es mir vielleicht auch möglich Ihnen bei Ihren Familienforschungen etwas weiterzuhelfen.

In unserem Archiv befindet sich der Lebenslauf der Ehefrau des von Ihnen gesuchten Johannes (John) Plattenberger, den ich Ihnen in Abfassung beifüge. Sie ersehen daraus, daß Barbara Plattenberger geb. Palmer, geboren 1712 "ohne Heit von Sinsheim" geboren war und einer Mennoniten-Familie entstammte, später aber der "reformirten Religion" beitrat. 1734 heiratete sie Johannes Plattenberger und wanderte mit ihm und zwei Kindern nach Pennsylvania aus. Daß sie 9 Jahre älter gewesen sein soll als ihr Mann ist dennach kaum möglich. Die Familie muß sich wohl dann in Warwick PA. angesiedelt haben, einem Ort aus dem später die noch heute bestehende Brüdergemeine Lititz entwachsen ist. Ihr Beitritt zur Brüdergemeine erfolgte 1749. Barbara Plattenberger starb in Warwick am 26.1.1758 und hinterließ von ihnen insgesamt 9 Kindern 4 Söhne und 2 Töchter. Die älteste Tochter, die schon von Ihnen erwähnte Anna Maria, befand sich zu dieser Zeit im sogen. Schwesternhaus in Lititz einer Einrichtung der Brüdergemeine für die ledigen "Schwestern" der Gemeine.

Anna Maria Plattenberger, über die ich keine Unterlagen besitze, ist auf jeden Fall, wie Sie das auch schreiben, 1737 noch in der alten Heimat geboren. "Lower Palatinate" oder richtiger "Palatines" heißt wörtlich Unter-Pfalz. Es könnte aber auch Unter bzw. Süddutschland damit gemeint sein, da zur damaligen Zeit für die englischen Bevölkerungen in Nord-Amerika der Begriff "Palatine" ein Sammelbegriff für alles Deutsche war.

Über das Schicksal von Johannes Plattenberger besitze ich keinerlei Unterlagen. In Waxwiek/Lititz ist er jedenfalls nicht gestorben, da er in der mir vorliegenden Liste der dort auf dem Gotzenacker beigesetzten nicht enthalten ist. Dieses Verzeichnis enthält nur zwei verstorbene Kinder und zwar

+ Lititz 12.4.1750 an Zahnpfleger

Am 26. Januar 1758 ging unsere 1. Schwester Barbara Plattenbergerin, geb. Palmerin, zu ihrem ewigen Manne heim. Sie war anno 1712 in der Pfalz ohnweit von Sinsheim geboren. Ihre Eltern waren Mennoniten, in deren Gesinnung sie aufgezogen wurde. Sie trat aber bei zunehmenden Jahren zur reformierten Religion. Anno 1734 heiratete sie den nunmehrigen Witwer Johannes Plattenberger. Mit dem und ihren 2 Kindern kam sie anno 1743 in dieses Land. Sie war von Kind an um ihre Seligkeit bekümmert und blieb bei aller ihrer Gottesdienlichkeit ohne Ruhe ihres Herzens, bis sie hier den Br. Nyberg (Bruder Nyberg) von der Gnade in Jesu Blut predigen hörte, worauf sie auch bald Gelegenheit kriegte, von Geschwistern aus der Gemeine als Neiberts und Christl. Heinrich besucht und gepflegt zu werden.

Von da an war der blutige Heiland ihr einziges Herzens-Objekt, zu dem sie sich als eine Sünderin wendete und da kriegte sie ein leichtes und lichtes Herz.

Anno 49 im November, als der Synodal in Warwick war, wurde sie in die Gemeine aufgenommen und das folgende Jahr, den 05. Juli gelangte sie zur hlg. Communion. Sie war seitdem als eine in Jesu Marter lebendes Sünder-Herz als eine treue, sorgfältige Haus-Mutter und als eine geschäftige Gemeine-Dienerin unter uns legitimiert. Sie muß wohl eine Ahnung gehabt haben von ihrem baldigen Heimgang; denn sie legte und machte sich die Woche vorher ihre Grabkleider zurecht. Den 14. dieses (Monats) genoß sie Jesu Leichnam und Blut im heiligen Sacrament das letzte Mal und war in den nächstfolgenden Tagen so munter und aufgelebt, und dabei so liebhabend, daß alle Geschwister, mit denen sie umging, ihre eigene Anmerkung über sie machten. Den 16. wurde sie krank und war von dem Tage an um alles unbekümmert, so daß sie sich auch mit ihren Kindern gar nicht mehr abgab. Nur einmal redete sie mit ihrem leiblichen Bruder, um den sie bekümmert war, sehr zum Herzen. Man merkte und hörte übrigens nichts von ihr, als ein sehnliches Verlangen nach ihrem einzigen geliebten Herzen. Den 23. sagte sie zur Schwester Neißerin, die sie besuchen kam: Ich bin ein armes, sündiges Würmlein und habe, wenn ich zum Heiland komme, nichts aufzuweisen, als sein blutiges Verdienst und Gerechtigkeit, darauf will ich zu ihm gehen, wenn es Ihm gefällt; und den dritten Tag darauf holte Er sie im 46. Jahr ihres Alters.

Ihr Gedächtnis bleibt unter uns im Segen. Sie war eine Mutter von 9 Kindern, wovon noch 4 Söhne und 2 Töchter hienieden sind, und die älteste Anna-Maria im led. Schwestern Chorhaus in Bethlehem ist und den 30. wurde ihre Hülle von vielem Volke, Geschwistern und Nachbarn zu Grabe begleitet.
