Increased activity at Dundalk was highlighted Tuesday, when eight ships were simultaneously engaged in discharging and loading cargo.

Marked the first time that all berths were occupied at the same time. A ninth berth is currently being constructed at the station.

Though the military cargo is a sizable portion of the general cargo, miscellaneous general cargo was also reported to be on hand for move.

Trend did not persist, however, with all products. Scrap metal imports for the year to date increased by 38.57 per cent over last year, and molasses was up 3.35 per cent for the same period.
